

Objective

Gain a basic knowledge of HTML so that when you work in Dreamweaver, you can use the Code View to your advantage.

Description

Create a basic HTML page in TextEdit or another Plain Text Editor. Use tags, attributes, values, fonts and color to design your page. You will be graded on your choice of color scheme, following directions, spelling, experimentation, design (I'm aware of the limitations you are facing right now) and writing proper HTML code. I will be looking at your code.

Your page must include the following:

- DOCTYPE info at the beginning of your document
- A Background Color (Even if it's white, it must be in the code)
- Choice and color of font must be included in the code
- You must use Web-Safe Colors
- You must use Web-Safe Fonts
- Title
- Body Content
- At least four sections
- At least one image per section
- All images and information must be credited to the original source.
- All images must come from an internet source. In order for images to show up properly, their complete web address must be included in the src attribute. If you have a particular image you would like to use that is not online, I can upload it to my site and give you the URL.
- Section 1: A short bio with information about the city you grew up in or identify with most. You must also include at least one image of the city with at least two hyperlinks to Web Sites that provides more information about the city.
- Section 2–4: Short descriptions of three of your interests/hobbies. Each interest must include at least one image and three hyperlinks to Web Sites that provide further information about the interest/hobby.

Important Dates and Information

01/21—Any images you want me to upload must be ready for me to upload before class begins. That means, it must already be the appropriate size, have a short name that identifies it and its name must be written in lowercase letters with no spaces (it's important to get used to this). I will only accept images at the beginning of class.

01/28—Assignment should be completed, put on the server and ready for critique BEFORE class begins.

- Public server → Student Files → PROFESSOR → GRA2841C → Project 1. Place your HTML file inside the Project 1 folder. Make sure to name the file: yourlastname01.html
